A New Director in 2024!

As 2024 began, MPL wished a fond farewell to MPL Library Director Akilah S. Nosakhere, who retired after 7 years of MPL stewardship. While it is hard to lose the leadership skills and institutional knowledge of valued employees, the MPL Board of Trustees Personnel Committee, chaired by Traci Lutton, worked diligently to search for a new MPL Library Director.

Following a nationwide search, Alan Kornblau, most recently of Delray Beach, Florida accepted the position of MPL Library Director.

He is a graduate of Florida State University and has worked in a variety of roles at public libraries and library support organizations for a number of years. His tenure began in March of 2024 and he has embraced MPL and the Muncie community. He is an active fixture at Noon Rotary, the Kiwanis Club of Muncie, the MLK Dream Team, and other community initiatives that provide opportunities for Muncie Public Library to serve the Muncie and Center Township community.

2024 Highlights-Winter

Mary Lou Gentis, Maring-Hunt Library Manager, retired after 30+ years of service to MPL. A reception was held in her honor.

MPL joined the Soup Kitchen of Muncie to celebrate their 30th Anniversary with a stone soup lunch and story time. MPL customers generously donated food throughout February to support the Soup Kitchen of Muncie.

MPL collaborated with the Nonprofit Support Network to offer grant-writing training to local nonprofit employees and volunteers.

MPL partnered with the BSU Center for Middletown Studies and the Ross Community Center to host "Hillbilly Highway" author Max Fraser. The best-selling book traces the mass migration of southerners from depressed Appalachian areas such as Fentress County, Tennessee, as they sought work in northern industrialized areas, such as Muncie.











2024 Highlights-Spring

MPL Director Alan Kornblau encouraged everyone to explore Artificial Intelligence. He used prompts to create a weekly AI Story featured on the MPL YouTube channel and Facebook page. One of the most popular entries pitted Mothman (a North American cryptid) against Mothra (a famous Japanese film monster) and included AI generated art.

MPL served as a host site for the AARP Tax Aide program with tax help offered at Kennedy Library and Maring-Hunt Library throughout the tax season.

MPL employees served on the city-wide Total Solar Eclipse Steering Committee to coordinate and ready local organizations to host eclipse viewing events and parties. All MPL branches (except Carnegie Library due to little outdoor space) hosted watch parties that attracted hundreds of visitors, some from as far away as Michigan, who traveled to get a better view of this astronomical phenomenon.

















2024 Highlights-Summer

MPL welcomed Keith Roysdon and Douglas Walker for a Meet the Author event for "Cold Case Muncie."

The Summer Reading Program for all ages kept hundreds of kids and adults reading all summer long and entertained everyone with animal shows, crafting, and fun with science.

MPL participated in the Teen Works program whose students worked with the MPL Facilities



team to paint, weed, and maintain MPL buildings and green spaces.

2024 Highlights-Fall

MPL worked closely with the Paul Revere Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution to provide timely programming during Constitution Week, including a well attended lecture and discussion led by Ball State University Professor Dr. Darren Wheeler.

All branches got in the Halloween spirit and offered trick or treating and a special Pumpkins in the Pages event at Kennedy Library, with treats, games, and crafts.

Carnegie Lights was a special program in December. Unique animated video projections were mapped to the architectural features of the Carnegie Library building and set to music that accompanied live dancers. Partners were Ball State University Office of Immersive Learning, Harmony Movement Studio, Muncie Downtown Development, and Muncie Public Library.













Book Distribution Partnership with Classroom Connections of ECI

For the past several years MPL has partnered with Classroom Connections of ECI to distribute books as part of the BSU Homecoming Parade. 2024 was no different with thousands of books being given away. However, Stacy Wheeler, Executive Director at Classroom Connections, secured an even bigger inventory of Scholastic books and wanted to do more. She invited MPL to serve as a distribution point to give these books away. The books included picture books, chapter books, activity books, paperbacks, hardcovers, and more. Library visitors were encouraged to stop by any MPL branch to get a free book each day throughout the program while supplies lasted! Children and their caregivers truly enjoyed and appreciated this effort that put books into the hands of thousands of young people!












